KACECE Rain Water Collection Project: Due to the threat of the shortage of water experienced this year, and the inspiration from the new Kitchen, we have installed three 5000 liter tanks to collect rain water from the school roof. This project is supported by funds provided by North side Baptist Church, Darien, Georgia. The water from the tanks is piped directly to the kitchen mainly for cooking and drinking. It is estimated that when all the tanks are full, we will have enough water to last for at least a month. The water needs at KACECE have, through this project, been minimized.

Kongasis Women Group Project: This project is also supported by Joining Hearts and Hands. The women are involved in a tailoring project making school uniforms and more recently pretty coats and seat covers using a sewing machine. The group also trains those interested in tailoring and embroidery. It is exciting to see women working together and learning the art of business.



Sponsorship of Needy Children: We have many requests from members of the community to support needy children. We are grateful for individuals who continue to support such children. We need more support in this area. It only costs \$ 300 per year to provide a Christian education to a youth who would otherwise not be able to afford to go to school.
